consideration at the March 18, 2024 meeting.

VIII. OAKS POOL UPDATE: Trustee Shapiro mentioned that he would like to look at demographic data to determine whether the Oaks neighborhood would benefit from a specific design of the pool. For example, if there was a significant number of older/ younger residents routinely visiting a certain pool(s), then that pool could be tailored towards a specific usage.

Colette Sheldon (Ponds resident) indicated that she felt that tailoring the pools towards a specific demographic could be difficult because the demographics of the neighborhood are always changing, i.e., kids growing older may not use a pool for the same reasons as they did when they were younger, etc.

IX. <u>COMMUNITY CENTER USER GUIDELINES</u>

<u>UPDATE</u>: Ms. Winslow reported that the staff is working on the revised guidelines and plans to have a draft version to the Board in April.

X. STORMWATER POND 11-B TREE REMOVAL

ISSUE: Mr. Gloyd stated that he had reached out to Supervisor Walkinshaw's office to discuss the county's plans for the tree removal at the stormwater pond 11-B. The county is hiring a geotechnical engineer to analyze the impact of the trees on the north side of the dam to see if indeed those trees need to be removed. The County does not anticipate hearing back or having a final decision from the state until next year.

On the south side of the dam, there are several trees within a county easement which the state has said absolutely must go. Additionally, the County pointed out another small section across the pathway towards Marshall Pond that had four or five large dead trees as well as several smaller understory trees which the county offered to remove while performing the other tree work. Mr. Gloyd examined the trees himself and verified that they were dead and should come out. Mr. Gloyd agreed to the County's offer on the south side and work should begin in around a month.

A decision will be put off for the North side while the County works with their consultant to gather the information they need to present their case to the State. The County reiterated that they would contact the affected homeowners if it looked like the trees on the North side of the dam were going to have to be removed.

XI. LANDINGS PICKLEBALL CONVER-

SION PROJECT UPDATE: The Pickleball Association voted to disapprove the lighting recommendations made by Bishop's Tennis feeling that the recommendation did not meet their needs. The Pickleball Association will be meeting on sight with electric contractors to discuss lighting needs. Additionally, Mr. Gloyd explained that the County may require a site plan review for the PRC for the lighting changes/

XII.<u>TREE SURVEY PROGRESS</u>: The BOT epressed that this topic was sufficiently discussed

during the Executive Director's report. No further discussion ensued.

XIII. <u>FEBRUARY MEETING AGENDA</u>: An update regarding the Wilmington Drive traffic-calming measures and an ARB application for a Wood Mouse Cluster sign were both added to the agenda.

XIV. <u>EXECUTIVE SESSION</u>: President Flaster motioned to adjourn at 8:55 PM into Executive Session for the purpose of discussing a contract issue. Hearing no objections, the motion passed unanimously. The meeting reconvened at 9:23 PM.

XV. <u>**ADJOURNMENT**</u>: Hearing no objections, the meeting adjourned at 9:23 PM.




